1.	Welcome	KM welcomed all to the meeting. The meeting began at 7pm and was quorate. The meeting was held at school and chaired by KMa

Declarations of Interests	Kevin Moyes is Chair of Governors at Five Acres Primary School in Bicester, Carterton Primary School and Bloxham Primary School, He has also been commissioned to undertake work for the Ridgeway Education Trust. Kevin also undertakes Governance Reviews on behalf of the LA. Gill Locke, Staff Governor, is also the school Business Manager. ET is training to be a SENCO and teaches at a (non-Trust) primary school in Watchfield.

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6.	Matters arising not covered on the agenda	There were no new matters arising.		
7	Headteacher's Report	<p>7.1 KA presented the May Headteacher's Report. Issues discussed included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are 280 children on roll and 13 have EHCPs • Attendance is an excellent 95% • There have been three fixed term exclusions, and one has required a multi-agency intervention. However, behaviour, generally, has been very good. • The school has recruited a new TA who started after Easter and recruitment to several other TA vacancies is ongoing. KA has 'spread the net wide' and invited applications from gap year students. • SATS began on 12th May and have been conducted in a 'calm and studious atmosphere'. The organisation of SATS and security of papers etc, was monitored by Governors and the Cambrian SIP. • Pupil Progress Meetings are currently active. • It is hoped that 80% of children will 'pass' the phonic screening assessment this year. • KS1 SATS will be delivered to small groups of children. This assessment process was very useful last year. It gives the children a gentle introduction to external assessment and confirms (or otherwise) teacher self-assessments. • The 2025 Parent Survey is positive. Only 34 families responded but comments about Gateway's pastoral care and support are very encouraging. • The headteacher and Deputy have attended training on 'reduced autonomy'. Over the last three years, it has been necessary to strip away any idiosyncratic approaches to classroom practice and ensure that all teachers 'follow the same script'. This approach has raised standards throughout the school. However, this approach can fetter curiosity and ambition, and senior staff feel it is now time to allow staff the freedom, when appropriate, to 'step out of the box'. <p>7.2. The April attendance report was shared with colleagues before the meeting. The January to April attendance is 94.78% for the whole school, 95% for SEN pupils, 95% for service pupils and 78% for children with EHCPs. Ten Parent Notices have been issued during this period. The school is in the 40% to 50% decile nationally and 128th out of 243 Oxfordshire schools.</p> <p>7.3. The results of the 2025 Parent Survey were circulated before the meeting. The general results are very positive. For example, 94% agreed that their child was being supported to make good progress. There were very few 'don't knows' suggesting improved school/home communication. 9% did not feel there were sufficient after-school clubs and enrichment activities and large number of those with SEN children felt that their children do not receive appropriate support. KA explained that many SEN parents feel that their children should have one to one support in all lessons, and this is obviously impractical and unrealistic.</p> <p>A Governor asked if the Cambrian Trust offers the same level of support for excluded children as the LA. RS explained that OCC has direct and natural links to agencies and health care professionals with a range of specialist skills that the Trust does not have.</p>	<p>7.1. 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		<p>However, OCC still oversees exclusions, and provides resources, in Trust member schools.</p> <p>A Governor asked if the Year 6 SATS writing decisions (teacher assessment) will be moderated this year. KA confirmed that they will be externally moderated by a visitor from Ducklington School. She will sample just five of the thirty Year 6 portfolios.</p> <p>A Governor asked if the Cambrian Trust Improvement Partner is providing the same high level of support as earlier. KA felt that she would prefer the visits to be more challenging and involve, if necessary, robust comments about classroom issues identified during a learning walk. She suspects that the Cambrian merger issues are absorbing much of the available capacity at the Trust and associate member schools are not a top priority. A Governor will join KA when the SIP next visits in July. ET added that the Trust SEN network meetings are excellent.</p> <p>A Governor noted that the attendance of FSM pupils, rests in the lowest national decile. She asked if this is an issue of concern. KA explained that FSM attendance will remain a priority for the leadership team. However, the number of FSM children in the school is low and the data will be skewed by small changes in attendance. Governors will undertake a monitoring deep dive of FSM children and consider attendance, behaviour and progress data as priorities</p>		<p>KA</p> <p>All</p>

Reading has been a key focus of learning walks and is assessed regularly. It is supported by celebratory posters around the site. The school values, ethos and vision have recently been reviewed, and this has led to the development of a vision and values document which has now been shared with staff. The document identifies how Gateway expects staff to conduct themselves and 'live out these values.' EYFS teaching has improved significantly and phonics teaching is secure. 		<p>HL notes that 57.5% of Year 3 pupils are reaching the expected level in writing and 63.7% are reaching the expected level in maths.</p> <p>The data pack also includes progress data. For example, 95% of Year 5 children are making or exceeding the expected progress in reading, 100% are making or exceeding the expected progress in writing and 95% are making or exceeding the expected progress in maths. 60.6% of Year 3 children are at or above the expected level in writing but all of them made their expected progress in writing.</p> <p>Governors discussed the most appropriate format for monitoring pupil data in 2025-6. Colleagues feel that three data points a year, January, March and June will be more manageable and insightful than six. Other monitoring visits will support these data points by focusing on strategic data. For example, SEN monitoring will necessarily require an analysis of data and Governors will continue to attend pupil progress meetings. Colleagues feel that these overlapping arrangements will ensure full coverage of the pupil progress and attainment data. KMa will ask KM for advice on this issue.</p> <p>10.4 KM made a Finance/Health and Safety Monitoring visit on 3rd May prior to the presentation of the Budget. Notes to follow.</p> <p>10.5 Staff attendance this year has been strong. There has been no long-term absence this year and much of the absence recorded has been pre-arranged and/or compassionate. Teachers are given a day of PPA per fortnight and this ensures that hospital appointments etc are made during this time and do not disrupt school activity.</p> <p>10.6/7 The budget has now been approved by Governors and OCC. The budget will balance each year and by the end of the academic year, the historic deficit from the federation will be cleared. KA reports 'this feels like a huge milestone for the schools ongoing safety and progress. This will allow us to plan with more ambition for the upcoming academic years'. The number of pupils with complex learning issues has increased, and school is likely to recruit further TA support than accommodated in the original budget.</p> <p>10.8 KMa undertook a learning walk earlier and gave a brief verbal summary of this visit. KMa felt that inclusion was a 'stand out feature' of the visit. Presentations, classroom equipment and teaching were appropriate and strategic and</p>					



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		<p>learning was focused on the individual. The report will follow.</p> <p>10.9 A premises update, including planned holiday works, will be presented at the July meeting.</p> <p>10.10 The Gateway School Association remains active and, for example, recently financed the new free readers. Planned GSA events this summer include a 'colour run' and summer disco/beach party. The Chair will step down after the summer due to relocation and school is hopeful that an existing member will seamlessly step into this role.</p> <p>Gateway has supported recent town council events including the production of VE Day rocks and these are on display at the Town Hall.</p>	(verbal update) Confirm prospectus type information on the school's website is up to date.
