The Capital income will be £7.3K in the first year and £7.5K each year thereafter.

GL explained that a deficit was anticipated at the start of the year but thanks to careful financial management and a significant inflow of funding from wrap around care, the school can anticipate a £21K carry forward in 2025-6. Furthermore:

- PP and Service Premium formulae have been adjusted by the Government, and this will increase income going forward. There are 26 PP children and 164 SP children or roll.
- The school has received a £25K uplift to support the Government's increase in National Insurance contributions
- The Sport Premium and USM funding formulae have also been adjusted and will provide additional income.
- The income from wrap around care is £97K (with a surplus of £68K on this item).
- Lettings bring in £13K of funding each year.
- Teacher and support staff pay increases have been built into the budget along with inflationary costs of 2.5%. Water and energy are expected to increase by more than 2.5% and this has been factored into the budget. There should be no unexpected surprises.

KA felt that this encouraging position may enable the long-term ambition to restore the school kitchen, closer to realisation.

KM asked if pupil numbers are accurate. The budget is critically dependent on a school roll of 300 plus. KA answered that the numbers are realistic and based upon the number of children in the school currently and the number of September 2025 admissions. The soon-to-leave year 6 class is relatively small and will be replaced by 'full' year groups henceforth. New affordable houses are being built in the town and the Base continues to grow. Brize Norton PS will move to a new site and has plans to grow but this will be a gradual process and is unlikely to have an impact on Gateway admissions. Moreover, Gateway has a stronger 'OFSTED profile' that some other primaries in the town.

KM also notes that the school is projected to be in a stronger position than anticipated. The deficit repayment will continue as planned and the school is projected to have a small surplus

	<p>in year one, over 100K in year 2 and over 200K in the outer years. When the school received an RI OFSTED judgement a few years ago, there was great external pressure to cut classes and staffing. The decision made by Governors and school leaders at that time to maintain the staff structure and to grow the school is now totally justified. That decision has proved to be in the best interest of the whole Gateway school community and will enable the school to face the future with confidence.</p>
