Main Learning focus - Science

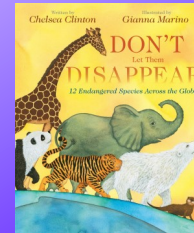
Children will be learning about different habitats and understanding why different animals adapt to different habitats and climates.

We will be visiting the Living Rainforest to see animals and habitats in real life.



English

In English we will be exploring two books for this topic. This first book is a fiction book called 'Mr Tiger Goes Wild' during this unit, we will be persuading our peers to 'go wild' and have fun. The second book is called 'Don't let them disappear' we will be using this book as a stimulus for some non-fiction writing.



Mathematics

In maths we will be looking at the place value of different numbers.

Year One are comparing and ordering numbers as well as using a number and naming ordinal numbers.

Year Two are counting in steps of two, five and ten and using a range of resources to support this where appropriate.

We will then be moving on to addition and subtraction.

Geography

In Geography, we will be learning about different climates in the world. We will identify these different climates on the map of the world and discuss human and physical features of these climates. This will be linked to the animals which live there.

Art and Design

We will be studying the work of Henri Rousseau and using pencil skills to create a hidden animal picture inspired by him.



Computing

In computing we will be understand what technology means, labelling parts of computers and using chrome books to develop mouse and keyboard skills.



Music

We will be listening to songs with animals in, such as 'The animal fair' and using this to sing in melodies and with an awareness of the audience.

RE

In RE we are asking if God wants Christians to look after the world? This discovery question will lead to us exploring the Christian creation story.



PE

We will be focusing on the physical cog during indoor gymnastics where we will be linking jumps together and include changes in level/speed and direction. In outdoor PE we will be focusing on the physical cog developing our throwing skills.
